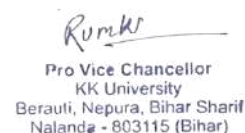

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1. About the University

The K. K. University (KKU), Nalanda established under the Bihar Private Universities Act 2013 and passed by the Cabinet of Government of Bihar in its meeting held on May 16, 2017 has been notified vide 15/M 1-38/2014-1147 dt. June 8, 2017. It aims to offer quality higher education and focuses on modern teaching methodologies while fostering an environment conducive to research, innovation, and holistic development. Located in the historically significant district of Nalanda, known for its ancient educational heritage, K.K. University is positioned to contribute to both regional and national academic growth.

The Samajik Kalyan Sanstha as its sponsor aims at providing quality education in the fields of sciences, humanities & social sciences, paramedical, engineering, commerce and management, pharmacy, etc. by establishing appropriate infrastructure suitable to the spread of higher education (HE), vocational education & training (VET), and industry specific employment oriented programs for the development of trained manpower at various levels enabling overall growth of Bihar ,and also, help India establish global linkages as supplier of trained human resources across the world.

University stands as a premier institution sprawling over a 24-acre campus with a built-up area that accommodates 112 classrooms and 70 teaching labs, maintaining a commendable computer-student ratio of 1:10 with 542 terminals. The university's robust sports infrastructure includes facilities for cricket, football, volleyball, kabaddi, kho-kho, athletics, basketball, and various indoor games. Its central library spans 24,720 square feet and boasts a collection of 13,692 books and 84 journals, supplemented by numerous e-journal databases. With 1,753 students enrolled for the academic year 2021-22, the university maintains a student-teacher ratio of 1:20, supported by 244 teaching staff and 112 non-teaching staff. The academic structure encompasses 9 departments offering a total of 55 programs: 22 undergraduate, 20 postgraduate, 6 diploma, and 7 Ph.D. programs, ensuring a comprehensive educational experience. Expanding further, K.K. University also prides itself on its state-of-the-art facilities and infrastructure. The campus includes spacious lecture halls, modern laboratories, and a well-equipped library to support academic pursuits. A commitment to best practices, sustainability, and a robust research culture underscores its dedication to producing well-rounded, future-ready graduates. K.K. University's holistic approach to education is designed to foster well-rounded individuals who are not only proficient in their chosen fields but also equipped to contribute meaningfully to society.

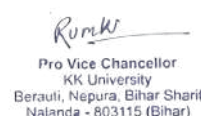
3. Vision, Mission & Core Values

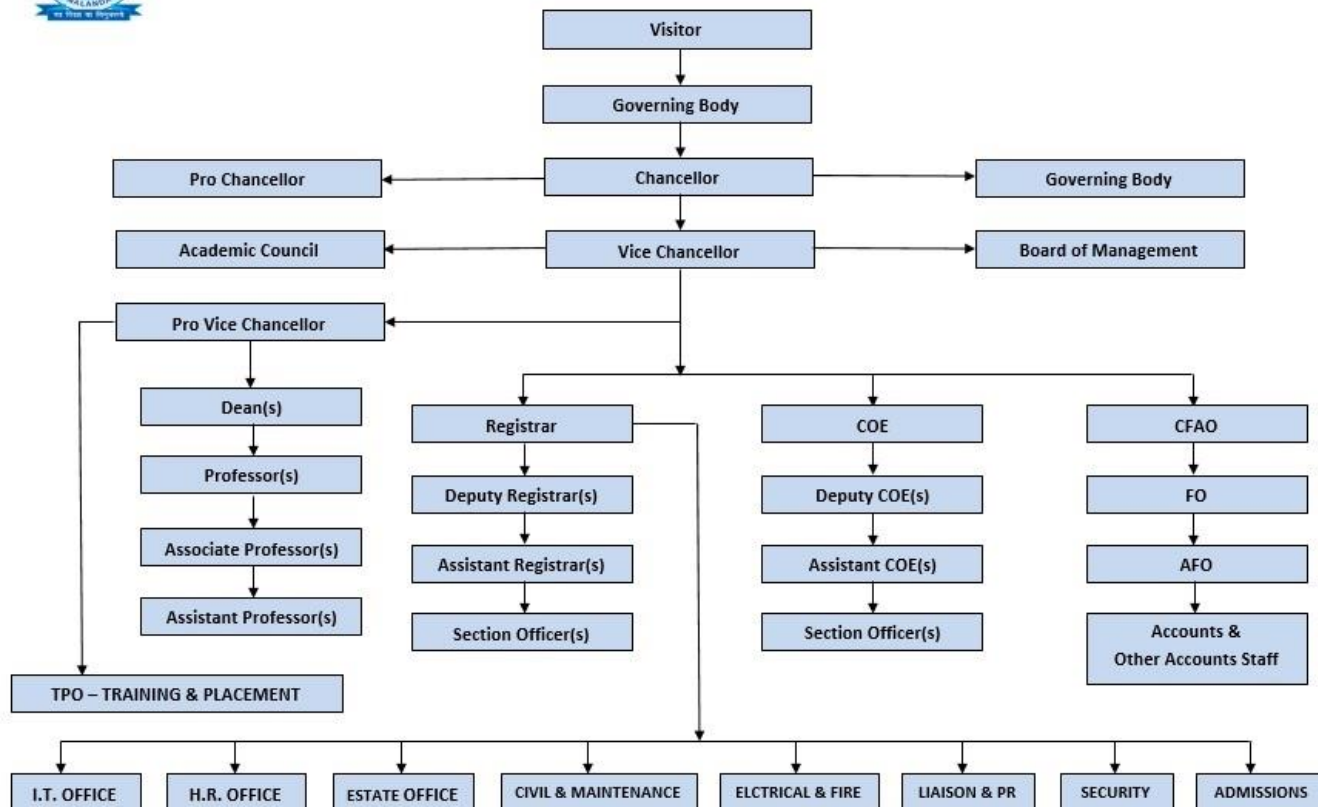

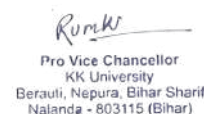

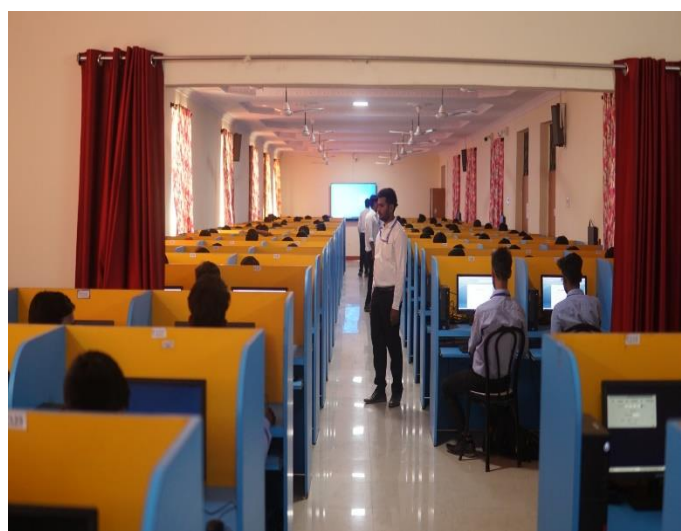
8. University Facilities

11. Examination Schedule

The University follows a structured Examination Schedule designed to ensure timely assessments and promote academic progress across all programs. The examination system includes mid-term exams, end-term exams, practical exams, and continuous assessments based on the course structure. Operating on a semester-based system, the academic year is divided into odd (July-December) and even (January-June) semesters. Mid-term exams occur mid-semester, helping students gauge their understanding, while end-term exams take place at the semester's end, covering the full syllabus. Practical exams, internal assessments, and supplementary/backlog exams are conducted as required. The Examination Department issues timetables and notifications in advance, and results are declared a few weeks post-exams, ensuring a smooth academic process.

15. University Best Practices

16. Training & Placement Cell and its Achievements

The Training and Placement Department of the University plays a vital role in preparing students for emerging opportunities in industry and the corporate sector. The Department is committed to creating an efficient, professional, and productive platform that facilitates meaningful interaction between students and prospective employers and helps establish the right person–position fit. It provides a broad range of career development services, training programmes, guidance, and resources to support students in their career planning, skill enhancement, and job search.

A key responsibility of the Training and Placement Department is to bridge the gap between academia and industry and ensure that students are provided equal access to career-oriented interventions and employment opportunities. The Department continuously works towards enhancing the skills, competencies, and employability of students through initiatives such as career counselling, need-based training, industry-oriented curriculum inputs, aptitude development, communication skills, soft skills training, and professional development programmes.

The Department also facilitates campus recruitment drives, job fairs, internships, industrial visits, industry interactions, and other experiential learning opportunities. Regular interaction with industry professionals enables students to gain valuable insights into current industry practices, workplace expectations, emerging technologies, and the evolving requirements of the corporate sector.

The University's focus on quality infrastructure, innovative teaching-learning practices, practical exposure, and holistic student development complements the efforts of the Training and Placement Department. The Department strives to prepare students not only for employment but also for entrepreneurship, innovation, and leadership roles in a rapidly changing and increasingly competitive professional environment.

The Department further strengthens its career-support ecosystem by maintaining meaningful engagement with the University alumni network, encouraging alumni–student interaction, mentorship, industry connections, and the creation of additional career and professional opportunities for students.

Through these sustained efforts, the Training and Placement Department remains committed to empowering students with the knowledge, skills, confidence, and professional competencies required to build successful careers and contribute effectively to society and the nation.

Placement Policy & Guidelines:

The Training and Placement Cell plays a vital role as a facilitator, counsellor, and coordinator for placement-related activities at the University. The Cell provides guidance and assistance to all registered students in accordance with the prescribed institutional norms and procedures. It works towards bridging the gap between academic learning and industry expectations by preparing students to meet the evolving requirements of the professional world.

As an essential component of the placement process, the Cell organizes training programmes in soft skills, communication skills, aptitude, interview preparation, and other employability skills for undergraduate final-year students. These training programmes are conducted with the support of faculty members as well as industry experts and professionals, enabling students to gain both academic guidance and practical industry exposure.

The emphasis of the Training and Placement Cell is to create a learning environment that encourages students to develop their intellectual, practical, interpersonal, and social competencies in a holistic manner. Special focus is given to developing leadership qualities, socially responsible behaviour, effective communication, problem-solving abilities, and a commitment to lifelong learning. The overall objective is to make students industry-ready, enhance their confidence, and create awareness about the importance of acquiring relevant, contemporary, and industry-oriented skills to successfully compete in the job market.

The Cell also provides career counselling and guidance to students through various interactive sessions, workshops, and awareness programmes. These initiatives are aimed at helping students understand diverse career opportunities, identify their strengths and interests, set realistic career goals, and develop appropriate strategies to achieve them. The counselling sessions are designed to provide students with proper direction and motivation while preparing them for their respective career paths.

In the forthcoming period, the University also proposes to introduce dedicated programmes and workshops on entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial skills to further enhance students' career prospects. These initiatives will encourage students to explore entrepreneurship as a viable career option, develop innovative thinking, understand business opportunities, and acquire the skills required to become successful entrepreneurs. Through its integrated approach to training, counselling, placement, and entrepreneurship development, the Training and Placement Cell remains committed to enhancing the overall employability, confidence, and career readiness of the students.

Eligibility Criteria for Students:

The following eligibility criteria shall be applicable to students seeking to participate in the campus placement process:

- a. The student must have successfully cleared all papers of every semester.
- b. The student must not have any backlog or uncleared subjects at the time of placement.

- c. The student must secure a minimum of **50% marks in internal assessments**.
- d. All students eligible for placement shall register with the **Training & Placement Office (TPO)** at the end of the 4th semester in the prescribed format provided by the Training & Placement Department.
- e. A student involved in any case of indiscipline or misconduct shall be disqualified from participating in the campus placement process.
- f. Students must attend all training and skill-development programmes organized by the University/Institute as part of the placement preparation process.
- g. In the case of a **Job Fair/Career Fair**, students shall attend and participate as per the instructions and schedule communicated by the Training & Placement Office (TPO).

Students Guidelines for placement:

- a. **Internship and Placement:** A student who declines an internship offered through the Training & Placement Cell shall inform the Placement Office in writing through the respective Faculty Mentor. An internship that has the potential to lead to a job offer shall also be treated as a placement opportunity in the concerned company.
- b. **Choice of Company:** Students may choose placement opportunities based on their academic programme, specialization, skills, and career interests, subject to the eligibility criteria prescribed by the recruiting organization.
- c. **Screening and Shortlisting:** Students shall be required to participate in any screening test, aptitude test, written examination, group discussion, interview, or other selection process conducted by the Training & Placement Cell at the request of recruiting organizations. Only the list of eligible and shortlisted students shall be forwarded to the concerned company.
- d. **Dress Code:** Students must be formally dressed whenever they participate in any interaction with a company, including Pre-Placement Talks (PPTs), written tests, group discussions, interviews, and other recruitment activities.
 - **For Men:** Formal shirt and trousers, tie, and formal leather shoes.
 - **For Women:** Formal Salwar-Kameez (without inappropriate/flashy designs) or formal shirt and trousers with appropriate formal footwear.
- e. **Participation in Selection Process:** A student who applies for and is shortlisted or selected for a particular recruitment process shall participate in the complete selection procedure unless the student is eliminated or rejected by the recruiting company at any stage.
- f. **Placement Season:** The placement process shall remain ongoing throughout the academic session. It may commence at the beginning of the session and continue until the end of the session, depending upon the availability of recruitment opportunities and placement of students in various organizations.
- g. **No Personal Recommendation:** The Training & Placement Cell/Placement Committee shall not personally recommend or influence the HR personnel or representatives of any company for offering employment to any student. Selection shall solely depend upon the student's eligibility, performance, skills, and ability to successfully complete the company's selection process.

h. Submission of Offer Letter: Once a student is placed in a company, the student shall submit a photocopy or authenticated copy of the offer/appointment letter to the Placement Office for official record and future reference.

i. Documents and Identification: Students must carry their University Identity Card at the time of Pre-Placement Talks, written tests, group discussions, interviews, and other placement activities and shall produce it whenever demanded by the visiting company representatives, Training & Placement Cell staff, or their authorized representatives. Students shall also carry at least **four copies of their updated resume and two recent passport-size photographs** for GDs and interviews, wherever required.

j. Discipline and Decorum: Students shall maintain discipline, professional conduct, and decorum during all placement-related activities, both within and outside the University campus.

k. Negotiation of Compensation: Students shall not negotiate or bargain with company representatives regarding the Cost to Company (CTC), salary, benefits, or other terms of employment during the selection process. Any violation of this provision may result in strict disciplinary action and/or debarment from the placement process.

l. Communication of Issues: Any issue, grievance, or matter requiring clarification shall be communicated to the respective Student Placement Representative (SPR). The SPR shall take up the matter with the Training & Placement Cell for appropriate consideration.

m. Punctuality and Professional Conduct: Students are expected to maintain professional conduct and decorum in all interactions with company officials during Pre-Placement Talks, written examinations, group discussions, interviews, and other recruitment activities. Students must report to the designated venue on time and adhere to the schedule communicated by the Training & Placement Cell.

n. Mobile Phones and Examination Material: Students shall not use mobile phones or other unauthorized electronic devices in the presence or vicinity of company representatives during recruitment activities. Students are strictly prohibited from carrying, reproducing, photographing, or removing question papers or any other confidential examination material from the examination hall after a written test.

o. Misconduct: Any student found misbehaving, using inappropriate language, or engaging in misconduct with members of the Training & Placement Cell, company representatives, staff, or Student Placement Representatives may be debarred from participating in the placement process, in addition to any other disciplinary action deemed appropriate by the University.

p. Accuracy of Resume and Information: Students must provide only correct, complete, and verifiable information in their resumes, applications, and other documents submitted during the placement process. Any student found providing false, misleading, fabricated, or unverifiable information may be de-registered from the placement process and may also be subject to disciplinary action.

q. Unfair Means: Any student found adopting unfair means, malpractice, impersonation, cheating, misrepresentation, or any other unethical practice during the recruitment/placement process of a company shall be debarred from participating in the recruitment process of that company. The University may also initiate appropriate disciplinary action depending upon the nature and severity of the violation.

Placement Procedure and Guidelines

1. Student-Driven Placement - Placement activities at the Institute are primarily student-driven and are facilitated by the Training & Placement (T&P) Cell. At the beginning of each academic year, the Placement Committee shall prepare a comprehensive placement plan, develop the Institute's placement brochure, and circulate it among prospective recruiters and companies.

Students are expected to remain in regular contact with the Training & Placement Office for guidance, consultation, placement-related updates, and resolution of any individual issues or concerns.

2. Placement Information - It shall be the prime responsibility of every student to remain informed about all placement-related activities. Students must regularly check the placement notice board, placement portal, official communication channels, and/or contact the Training & Placement Department for information regarding:

- Campus Recruitment Drives;
- Company profile and job description;
- Eligibility criteria;
- Date and time of recruitment;
- Venue or mode of recruitment;
- Selection process; and
- Any other instructions issued by the recruiting company or T&P Cell.

3. Eligibility - Students must ensure that they fulfil all eligibility criteria prescribed by the recruiting company before participating in any recruitment process. The eligibility conditions may include academic qualifications, percentage/CGPA, backlog status, year of passing, age, branch/specialization, and other requirements specified by the company.

All academic and other relevant documents submitted by students shall be subject to verification. Any student found to have submitted false, manipulated, forged, or misleading information/documents at any stage of the recruitment process shall be liable for cancellation of candidature and withdrawal/termination of the placement offer. Such a student may also be debarred from participating in subsequent placement activities of the Institute, as per the decision of the competent authority.

4. Student Data - Every student registered with the Training & Placement Cell shall ensure that all personal, academic, contact, and other relevant information submitted to the T&P Cell is complete, accurate, and up to date.

In case of any change in the information provided, the student must immediately inform the Placement Officer/Placement Coordinator and ensure that the necessary corrections are made in the records.

Students shall be responsible for any consequences arising from incorrect, incomplete, or outdated information provided by them.

5. Placement Interview and Selection Process - The recruitment process may vary from company to company depending upon the requirements of the recruiter. Generally, the following stages may be included:

1. Pre-Placement Talk/Presentation about the Company and Job Profile;
2. Written/Aptitude/Technical Test;
3. Group Discussion, wherever applicable;
4. Technical Interview;
5. Human Resources (HR) Interview;
6. Verification of Academic and other relevant Documents; and
7. Any other test, assessment, interview, or selection procedure prescribed by the recruiting company.

The final selection process shall be determined by the respective recruiting company, and students shall be required to comply with the procedures and instructions communicated by the company and the T&P Cell.

6. Pre-Placement Talk (PPT) - All eligible students shall attend the Pre-Placement Talk (PPT) conducted by companies participating in campus recruitment drives for which they are eligible. The PPT is intended to provide students with information regarding the company, job profile, career opportunities, compensation, work location, selection procedure, and other relevant terms and conditions.

Students may decide not to participate further in the recruitment process after attending the PPT if they are not interested in the job profile or other terms communicated by the company.

However, once a student has appeared for and completed the first stage of the selection process, such as the written/aptitude/technical test, the student shall not be permitted to withdraw from the recruitment process without prior permission of the Training & Placement Cell.

Any eligible student who remains absent from subsequent stages of the recruitment process after appearing in the first round, without obtaining prior permission from the T&P Cell, may be debarred from participating in further placement activities during the placement season.

7. General Conduct During Placement - Students participating in campus recruitment shall maintain professional conduct and strictly follow the instructions issued by the Training & Placement Cell and the recruiting company. They shall report at the specified venue and time, carry the required documents, and maintain discipline throughout the recruitment process.

Any act of misconduct, misrepresentation, submission of false information, or deliberate violation of placement guidelines may result in cancellation of candidature and/or debarment from placement activities, as decided by the competent authority.

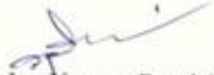

18. New Initiatives

The major initiatives undertaken during the year were as follows:

1. **Strengthening of Digital Academic Processes:** The University strengthened online systems for admission, registration, examination-form submission and dissemination of academic notices, thereby improving accessibility and administrative efficiency.
2. **Industry–University Collaboration:** The University expanded its engagement with industries and professional organizations through collaborations aimed at providing students with training, internships, placement opportunities and industry exposure.
3. **Entrepreneurship and Start-up Development:** Workshops and activities related to entrepreneurship development and start-ups were promoted through industry collaboration, encouraging students to explore self-employment and entrepreneurial opportunities.
4. **Skill Development and Employability:** Greater emphasis was placed on industry-oriented training and skill enhancement so that students could develop practical competencies in addition to their academic knowledge.
5. **Strengthening of Placement Activities:** The University initiated collaborations with placement organizations and recruitment agencies to provide students with better campus placement and employment opportunities.
6. **Resumption of Physical Classes:** With improvement in the pandemic situation, physical classes were resumed from February 2022, enabling students to return to regular classroom teaching and practical academic activities.
7. **Scholarship Facilitation:** The University facilitated students in applying for various scholarship schemes, including Post-Matric Scholarship and National Scholarship Portal schemes, and strengthened the process of document verification.
8. **Anti-Ragging and Student Safety Measures:** The University strengthened its anti-ragging mechanism and required students to submit anti-ragging affidavits to ensure a safe, disciplined and student-friendly academic environment.
9. **Student Health and Medical Documentation:** Medical fitness certification was incorporated into the student documentation process, contributing to better attention to student health and welfare.
